Managing a List of Lacemaker Resource Sites

When a fellow I.O.L.I. / NELG chapter member, Mary Magnan, asked for help improving Wikipedia's lace pages, I gladly volunteered. That project made me realize just how outdated my own Excel spreadsheet of lace resources had become. I was sure there were some broken links in there that needed to be fixed.

Automating the Tedious Work: I do not think I am alone in saying my exposure to OpenAI's ChatGPT (a generative artificial intelligence chatbot) as an "assistant" is limited (but growing with some help from my daughter). She introduced me to it when I wanted touch up a photograph – the result was great, and process was easy. If you are unsure about 'AI', have someone show you how first, or you can learn more about the ChatGPT AI on Wikipedia wikihow.com/Use-Chat-Gpt.




Figure 1. 2025 JMT LINK List tab has Joan's favorite lacing resources, and the link check formula in Column E.

I asked ChatGPT "How can I check the weblinks in my Excel file automatically?" One of the suggestions was to use a formula in Google Sheets, https://workspace.google.com/products/docs/. This approach combined two functions: ISERROR and IMPORTXML. I did not have to understand the coding—just copy and paste the formula into a cell to the right of the link, and change the formula's cell address to the link column, C2. See Figure 1.

Once the formula was in place, I copied it down the column, and now every time I open my Google Sheet file, the code checks all the links for me. The results show either OK or Broken or redirected, making it easy to keep the list current. Note: This method works only for public, non-password-protected links, and for batches of 50–100 links at a time. Also, be sure to include "https://" in the link address.

Keeping the List Alive: I know my list is only a starting point, but with this new file I am finally confident that I can keep it updated, organized, and useful for myself and others. Feel free to use my list and add any great sites you find to it!

I have included a few notes about my main categories below. My list is naturally biased toward vendors I have used over the years, and leans more heavily toward tatting, as I have been a tatter much longer than a maker of bobbin or Mediterranean knotted lace. For other lists, check out the items in *italics* for sites that also include link lists, especially the NELG website (<u>nelg.us/Lacemaking-Resources</u>).

Organizations & Learning Events: I track several local events, and often plan vacations or visits with family and friends around lace related events. Fiber fairs are now on my list as places to demonstrate lace. I met a small group of young tatters/fiber artists in my own town at this year's NELG demonstration at the CT Sheep, Wool, and Fiber event, https://ctsheep.com. They were looking for recommendations for fibers – and I certainly have tips to share with them! I recently started tatting with yarn – what fun!

Social Media – Virtual Groups and other places for "Eye Candy": There is plenty of inspiration in the pictures posted on the Internet on sites like Pinterest. Whenever I have spare time and want to see beautiful designs for Turkish Needle Lace (Oya), I will just type in "Iğne Oyası Yapımı" and dream!

I think we can all agree that social media has good and bad points. I love meeting new people, interacting on blog sites, and being inspired by the work of others, but I do NOT like it when people do not respect designer copyrights. You can find me lurking on these and other lacing sites.

Vendors: While the Internet is the #1 place now to find resources for lace making materials, I especially like to support vendors who can haul products to lace events! For the international shops listed – most of the time I try to organize a group order with other guild and lacemaking friends to save on shipping.

Patterns, Printed, & Video Resources: As you can tell, I look for free patterns, sites with good deals and instructions. YouTube is so full of helpful videos for all types of lace – just type in YouTube tatting or YouTube bobbin lace, and let your journey begin!

I know my list is just a starting point for lace resources, but at least now I can be sure it will stay up to date!
