PRACTICE! She says about 10 times before you get fluent.

Clip time	Notes	Snapshot
1:00	Start center; used 2 fingers; always hold thread or ring will open. Like a tatted ring. Make 12 petals	
3:13	Closeup – how to make the basic stitch Joan's first – see how I messed up on the 5 rows? 	 <p>Thread that goes over the needle creates the petal</p> <p>Thread coming out of the needle is brought forward over the thread and behind the needle.</p> <p>Only wrap thread on top when you join 2 looks and want an invisible stitch.</p>
4:21	Open to adjust spacing of petal (picot)	
4:25-4:56	Close and tie ring; pinch loops and pull the cut end.	 <p>PULL TO CLOSE CENTER RING</p>

<p>5:50-6:30</p>	<p>Finish first ring-knot on the petal tops; Not much space in between.</p>	
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<p>7:14 8:01- 10:50 finish</p>	<p>Next row – now knot in the open spaces- Uses a blind stitch to connect between bridges</p> <p>Stitch sequence: Small knot, picot (petal), small knot, blind stitch</p>  <div data-bbox="272 1045 574 1140" style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 2px;"> <p>Do blind stitch - wrap needle end over needle instead of behind it</p> </div>	
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<p>10:58 start next row</p> <p>13:49</p>	<p>Connect petals</p>

14:46

Stitch sequence:
1 small, 3 petals, 1 small, 1 invisible to
connect to the next hole

Knot on top of petals – larger space
between petal sets. Small spacing between
3 petals.




New thread goes under work, work
as usual - carry cut end into knot
for 2 stitches

<p>22:51 28:09 counting stitches</p>	<p>Do the 'netting' rows - 5 rows of small stitches all around in each hole; do 2 or more in the larger holes, 1 on the petal tops. To reduce – if you get ruffling – do an 'invisible' stitch, to add if your piece cups, do 2 stitches in one hole</p> <p>Count holes along the line until you have 5 rows (before and after the row you are working).</p> 	 <div data-bbox="1170 459 1446 590" style="border: 1px solid green; padding: 5px; width: fit-content;"> <p>If you do one more stitch, then the next row will have 6 holes in the row</p> </div>
<p>29:53-</p>	<p>Do larger bridges – skipping one or not, depending on the stitching.</p> 	
<p>32:49 start last ring 3:31 Second stitch starts at 34:07 36:23- shows variegated</p>	<p>Stitch sequence: 1 tight, 1 very small petal, got back into that hole and put the thread backwards over the needle and DON'T wrap needle end of thread around needle, then go back into the big hole of same stitch and do a regular stitch, then a small knot and an invisible stitch to repeat in the next hole.</p>  	<p>Connect motifs – looks like just with simple sewing</p>  <p><u>INSTEAD OF ENDING THE MOTIF WITH THIS ROW –</u></p> <p>See the advanced-row.mp4, and then these:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Araret mountain.mp4 • catapillar.mp4 • butterfly.mp4
